RESOLUTION of the GENERAL COUNCIL ONEIDA TRIBE OF INDIANS OF WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, the Constitution, By-Laws and Charter of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin are in need of revision to make them more effective working documents for the benefit of the members of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution, By-Laws and Charter of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin have been under study by the members of the Business Committee; and

WHEREAS, it is the concensus of the Business Committee that a Revised Constitution and By-Laws and a Revised Charter should be presented to the General Council of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the General Council of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has met in general council to review the proposed Revised Constitution and By-Laws and Revised Charter:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the General Council of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby petitions the Secretary of the Interior to call an election on the Revised Constitution and By-Laws and Revised Charter to allow the tribal membership to vote to accept or reject the Revised Constitution and By-Laws and Revised Charter at the earliest date possible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Business Committee is authorized to take any action which might be necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

CERTIFICATION

I, the undersigned, as Secretary of the Oneida Tribal Business Committee hereby certify that the Oneida Tribal Business Committee is composed of 9 members, of whom 5 members constitute a quorum, were present at a meeting called, noticed and held on the 4 day of Jan. 1975: 79 members were present, that the foregoing resolution was duly adopted at such meeting by a vote of 75 for, 0 against, and 0 abstentions, Said resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way.
