RESOLUTION # 1-19-94- G

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, to manage all the economic affairs and enterprises of the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: KRAHNS PROPERTY

A parcel of land being all of Government Lots 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14, Section 16; also all of Government Lots 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, E, the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4, and the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4, Section 21, all in T23N, R18E, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County Wisconsin, more full described as follows: Beginning at the West 1/4 Corner of said Section 21; thence N2, 43'48"E, 1921.78 feet along the West line of the NW 1/4 of said Section 21 to a point on the Northwesterly Township line of the Town of Oneida; thence along said Township line, N31°00'15"E, 897.24 feet to a point on the North line of the NW 1/4 of said Section 21; thence along said Township line, N28°49'44"E, 3046.63 feet to a point on the East-West 1/4 line of said Section 16; thence N88°26'12"E, 449.72 feet along said East-West 1/4 line to the Center of said Section 16; thence S1°40'43"E, 1295.94 feet along the East line of Government Lot 8 of said Section 16 to the SE Corner of said Government Lot 8; thence N88°26'22"E, 1215.89 feet along the North line of Government lots 11, 12, 13 and 14 of said Section 16, to the Northeast Corner of said Government Lot 14; thence S1°28'50"E, 1296.00 feet along the East line of said Government Lot 14 to the Southeast Corner of said Government Lot 14; thence S88°26'31"W, 1211.41 feet along the South line of said Government Lots 11, 12, 13, and 14 to the North 1/4 Corner of said Section 21; thence S0°59'21"W, 2679.69 feet along the North-South 1/4 line of said Section 21 to the Center of said Section 21; thence S87°42'49"W, 1252.00 feet along the East-West 1/4 line of said Section 21 to the Northeast Corner of Government Lot E of said Section 21; thence S2°29'27"W, 169.67 feet to the Southeast Corner of said Government Lot E;

thence S87°42'49"W, 1254.93 feet along the South line of said Government Lot E to the Southwest Corner of said Government Lot E; thence N3°28'28"E, 169.94 feet along the West line of the Southwest 1/4 of said Section 21 to the point of beginning.

Said parcel contains 261.18 acres of land more or less (259.32 less road) and is subject to all easements and restrictions of record, reserving that part presently being used for road purposes.

WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certified that the local property taxes will be paid up to Trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in Trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

CERTIFICATION
