## RESOLUTION # 01-21-98-D


### Employment and Training Administration for a Welfare to Work Grant

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, a priority of the Oneida Nation is to sustain our sovereign government, family, community, and afford all members the opportunities to participate in the economic resources, and
- WHEREAS, Oneida Center for Self Sufficiency helps Oneida Families by addressing the barriers which prevent clients from obtaining full time gainful employment and offering public assistance for those with limited or no other resources available to them, and
- WHEREAS, for the benefit of the Oneida Nation and Oneida families it is necessary to provide transitional assistance to move welfare recipients into unsubsidized employment which provides good career potential for achieving economic sufficiency.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits a grant application to the Employment and Training Administration for a Welfare to Work grant.
