## RESOLUTION # 2-28-96-B

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the General Tribal Council, and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Social Services Department, manages an Intensive Supervision Project working with Oneida youth who have been adjudicated juvenile delinquent, and


**WHEREAS,** the juvenile clients of the Intensive Supervision Project are high risk and would benefit from independent living skills programming to prepare them for emancipation, self-sufficiency, and a positive, healthy lifestyle;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin make application to the State of Wisconsin, Department of Health and Social Services, for an Independent Living Program grant to build tribal capacity for preparing at-risk youth of the Intensive Supervision Project to achieve self-sufficiency by providing basic living skills training, and related supportive services.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** that the Oneida Tribal Chairwoman, or the Vice Chair, is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any amendments thereto.

### CERTIFICATION
