RESOLUTION # 3-8-91-B

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians is faced with several varied threats to the surface and groundwater resources of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs provides funding to Indian Tribes for the purpose of identifying those threats.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin intends to contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for funds under the FY 1991 Water Quality Management Planning program to continue on-going cooperative ground water investigations on the Oneida Reservation. This investigation is a cooperative effort between the Oneida Tribe and the U.S. Geological Survey Water Resources Division. The Chairman of the Oneida Business Committee is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any amendments thereof. This contract is to commence on April 15, 1991.

CERTIFICATION
