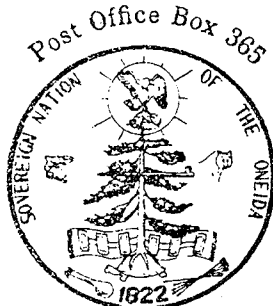


Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

## RESOLUTION NO. 3-11-83-M

WHEREAS, the Indian Self-Determination Act granted Tribes the right to contract for Bureau Programs, and,

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and,

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their endeavor.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee, request a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to providing special land or reality services from unbanded allocations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that contract negotiations, amendments and/or modifications be initiated through the Land Coordinator and the Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the proposed date will be October 1, 1983 and remain in effect for a period of one year.
