RESOLUTION No. 3-24-82-M


- WHEREAS, The Indian Self-Determination act granted Tribes the rights to contract for Bureau programs, and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their endeavor,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That, the Oneida Tribal Business Committee requests a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide assistance from any unbanded funds in staffing the Oneida Tribal Land Office, and,

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Tribal Administrator is authorized to negotiate the contract and any amends thereof, and the Land Office Coordinator is authorized to execute the contract and any amends there to.
