## RESOLUTION 3-27-79-A

- WHEREAS, the jurisdiction in accordance with the Constitution of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. extends to the boundaries as defined in 1838 and other lands as may be acquired by the Oneida Tribe; and,
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Reservation (lands) were surveyed in 1838 by United States surveyors; and,
- WHEREAS, such survey indicated a contained acreage of 65,400 acres more or less; and,
- WHEREAS, a Reservation map was drawn in 1872 from the survey notes of 1838; and,
- WHEREAS, such map indicates a 5% discrepancy (error) which reflects an approximate reduction of 3000 acres which appears on Reservation maps currently in use.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that all official records and documents of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. be corrected to reflect the exact acreage contained within the 1838 survey.
