RESOLUTION NO. 4-8-83-A

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is concerned with the housing needs, housing conditions, and housing programs of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, Legislation is being proposed by the Administration for a new Indian Housing Program which would involve F.H.A. mortgaging and Federal grants to assist in the development and financing of housing, water and sewer facilities, and

WHEREAS, Said legislation proposed by the Department of Housing and Urban Development bears no respect for trust status land with regard to F.H.A. and the requirement that the tribes must be co-mortgagers for said loan, and

WHEREAS, Said legislation proposed by the Department of Housing and Urban Development promotes elimination of the I.H.S. sanitation facilities as well as the Bureau of Indian Affairs Housing Improvement Program, and

WHEREAS, Indian Housing Authorities and Indian Tribes across the nation have not been consulted in regards to the formation of said legislation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe reject the original bill S644 Indian Housing and Block Grant as submitted.
