BUSINESS COMMITTEE RESOLUTION NO. 04-13-94-B
Intertribal Transportation Association

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, at the "Conference on Exploring Solutions to Native American Transportation and Economic Development Problems" held in May 1993, tribal leaders expressed the need to create an organization that would permit them to communicate with all tribes on transportation issues and that would represent tribal transportation concerns at state, regional and national levels, and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 1994, representatives from several tribes met and formally established the Inter-Tribal Transportation Association;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe recognizes and supports the formation of the Inter-Tribal Transportation Association and appoints the Planning Director or his/her designee, to represent the Tribe as a voting member of that Association.
