RESOLUTION NO. 6-6-77-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin have developed the necessary resources in trained personnel to successfully implement a Title Search Project, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Title Search Project has been favorably evaluated by two (2) independent attorneys, including one from the Bureau of Indian Affairs Solicitor's Area Field Office in Minneapolis who has the responsibility to develop this information, and

WHEREAS, even if the Statute of Limitations, 28 USC §2415, is extended it would take at least a year, or more to complete the basic identification of land claims within the original reservation boundaries,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin requests the necessary financial assistance from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to continue the Oneida Title Project which is necessary in the identification of land claims in Wisconsin and for which we have trained personnel to perform this work.
