

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin are endeavoring to develop an industrial complex in conjunction with the "Packerland Industrial Park" and in cooperation with the City of Green Bay, and

WHEREAS, a public works grant/loan was approved for the Oneida Tribe from the Economic Development Administration (EDA) on June 13, 1968, in the total amount of \$352,000, and

AS, the total estimated project cost is \$412,000, as determined in collaboration with the city engineers of Green Bay, which includes the purchase of 4.475 acres more or less of land from the said City to provide railroad access to the Oneida Industrial Park, and

AS, a totally complete public works project was planned and is desirable and advantageous to both the City and the Tribe, thus requiring the realization of any savings possible, an

WHEREAS, this project represents a supreme effort and a milestone on the part of the Oneida Tribe to improve and expand upon the economic, social and cultural welfare of the tribal membership, and

WHEREAS, the community of the City of Green Bay has from time to time extended overtures signifying their desires in assisting and cooperating with the Oneida Tribe to accelerate their progress in their acculturation and the elimination of hardship and abject poverty,

WHEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the executive committee of the Oneida Tribe, in special session duly assembled, quorum present, does hereby request that the City of Green Bay gift deed the said 4.475 tract to the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin in an expression of good faith, sincere interest and cooperativeness to the completion of the site development of the Oneida Industrial Park.
