## RESOLUTION 6-28-95-C

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Tribal Government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, a real sense of community involvement is crucial toward improving the quality of life on our reservation, and
- WHEREAS, as adults of the Oneida Nation we are all responsible for the example we portray to all Oneida people, and
- WHEREAS, Domestic violence and disintegration of families has been cause of undesirable social consequences reflecting negatively on the Oneida Nation, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the goal for the Oneida Nation is to protect all aspects of the childrens total environment and to revitalize the dignity of Oneida families.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe secure a stable environment for the children that is inclusive of their physical, mental, cultural and financial well being, and

BE IT YET FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribal Social Services Ka'NiKuhliyo Family Center Foster Child Placement Program facilitate the licensing of Oneida Foster Homes for placement of the Oneida Foster Children, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee approve the Oneida Foster Child Placement Program to recruit, train, and license any potential Native American families and/or non-Indian families within the state of Wisconsin as foster care providers for the placement of any foster children in accordance with the Indian Child Welfare Act.
