RESOLUTION NO. 7-8-83-A


- WHEREAS, The Native American Center at University of Wisconsin/Stevens Point developed and implemented the Associate Degree Program upon Tribal request; and,
- WHEREAS, The Associate Degree Program has been in operation for the past two years meeting the needs of the Tribes and students; and,
- WHEREAS, Since the Associate Degree Program is on a week-end basis, it provides Native American Adults the opportunity to receive an education while still having close contact with their family and reservation; and,
- WHEREAS, There is a great need for Tribal people to receive an education resulting in a lower unemployment rate and more skilled tribal members working both on and off reservation lands.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin fully supports the Native American Center seeking funds to continue the Associate Degree Program for the benefit of the Adult Tribal members.
