RESOLUTION 7-12-95-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Community Health Center has a responsibility to provide care in the least restrictive manner, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Community Health Center has in existence a well developed system for providing both institutional and noninstitutional health services for those in need of long term care and for accessing the full range of health related and social services available to its tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Community Health Center has developed a proposal for the demonstration project through the Indian Health Service, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Community Health Center proposal for providing health-related services specifically targeted for noninstitutional care will provide under the Indian Health Service, an opportunity to implement a long term care initiative demonstration, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Community Health Center is hereby authorized to submit a proposal to the Indian Health Service for a demonstration project to provide services to the disabled and elderly people in our community.
