RESOLUTION 7-29-92-C

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian tribe organized under a constitution and by-laws ratified November 14, 1936 by the tribal membership and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on December 21, 1936; and a federal corporate charter issued on April 14, 1937 by the Secretary of the Interior and ratified on May 1, 1937 by the tribal membership; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council as governing body of the Oneida Tribe delegated its corporate power to purchase lands on behalf of the Oneida Tribe to the Oneida Business Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee, after a recommendation by the Oneida Land Committee, determined on February 26, 1992 that it is in the best interest of the Oneida Tribe to purchase property located in Sections 16 and 21, Township 23 North, Range 18 East, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, commonly referred to as the "Krahn Property"; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee delegated to the Oneida Negotiations Committee the authority to negotiate the terms and method of purchase of the "Krahn Property" from the Farm Credit Bank of St. Paul; and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Negotiations Committee, acting under its authority determined that of said purchase should be made by land contract for a purchase price of \$270,000; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee approves of said method and amount of purchase,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Business Committee on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin designates Chairman Richard Hill and Treasurer Loretta Metoxen to act in its stead as signatories to the land contract for the "Krahn Property" binding the Oneida Tribe to such terms and conditions stated in the land contract.
