WHEREAS, Benjamin D. Vieau has a residential lease No. B-639 (71) of tribal land described as follows:

A parcel of land within the SW¹/₄SW¹/₄ Section 10, T. 24N., R. 19E, 4th P.M., Wisconsin, more particularly described as: Commencing at the SW corner of Section 10; thence East 429 feet to point of beginning; South 330 feet; thence West 165 feet to point of beginning, containing 1.25 acres, more or less, subject to valid rights-of-way of record.

WHEREAS, Benjamin D. Vieau is in breach of Section 16-Construction and maintenance of improvements.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee in regular session assembled, hereby cancels lease No. B-639 (71) and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the cancellation documents.
