* R E S O L U T I O N *

Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the Indians of Pennsylvania and the Colon of Pennsylvania, a nation, the United States was made possible.

WHEREAS, The Treaty of 1838 and recent Supreme Court decisions such as Bryan Vs. Itasca will provide for certain tax rebates for the Oneida Indians, and

WHEREAS, the Oneidas have an opportunity, at least, to assert their original tribal boundaries for taxation purposes, and

WHEREAS, a Declaratory Judgement should be sought to have the rights of the Oneidas declared by a three (3) Judge District Court,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribal Chairman and Vice Chairman be empowered to proceed with the documentation of the legal aspects of the controversy and to initiate legal action as necessary and to hire any legal counsel necessary to accomplish all that should be done with regards to the land rights, boundaries and taxation problems.
