RESOLUTION # 8-17-94 A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribe Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council as a Government has the responsibility to provide an adequate transportation system on roads on or providing access to Tribal trust and Reservation lands, and

WHEREAS, bridge No. P-44-0932, located .7 miles north of County Highway EE and Bridge No. P44-0931 located .5 miles south of junction State Highway 54 are both located on County Highway H, and

WHEREAS, bridge funds are available through the Bureau of Indians Affairs for the replacement of these structures, which would benefit all parties, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe Business Committee by this resolution supports the project and authorizes the Bureau of Indian Affairs to enter into a cooperative agreement with Outagamie County for the replacement of these bridges.
