
Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States was made possible.

Resolution # 10-5-83-C

- WHEREAS The Oneida Business Committee of Wisconsin recognizes that the number one cause of injuries to children is automobile accidents
- WHEREAS: The Oneida Business Committee recognizes that infant and child safety restraints effectively reduce the number and severity of automobile related injuries to children
- WHEREAS: The Bureau of Indian Affairs has made grant money available for the implementation of an infant and child safety restraints on Indian Reservations
- WHEREAS: We believe that our children are our most precious resource and in our children lies that future of the Oneida Nation.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee supports the implementation of an infant and child restraint program at the Oneida Health Center.
