RESOLUTION # 11-23-94-F

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Thomas Gerlach Property

WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows

A parcel of land being part of Government Lots Twelve (12) and Thirteen (13), and the West 1/2 of the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4, Section 8, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin which is more fully described as follows:

Beginning at the West 1/4 corner of said Section 8; thence S 89°06'15" E, 657.56 feet along the North line of the SW 1/4 of said Section 8 to the Northeast corner of the West 1/2 of the Northwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of said Section 8; thence S 00°06'29" E, 1316.73 feet along the East line of the West 1/2 of the Northwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of said Section 8 to the Southeast corner of said West 1/2; thence N 89°08'24" W, 165.04 feet along the South line of the Northwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of said Section 8; thence S 00°24'10" E, 1258.15 feet to a point on the Northerly right-of-way line of Ranch road as described in Jacket 3657, Image 34; thence N 89°02'24" W, 347.13 feet along said right-of-way line; thence N 44°37'12" W, 223.46 feet along said right-of-way line to a point on the West line of the Southwest 1/4 of said Section 8; thence N 00°00'22"E, 2417.78 feet along said West line to the point of beginning.

WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin. This Resolution supersedes Resolution #5-11-94 G.
