RESOLUTION NO. 11-6-78-I

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. has made numerous attempts to develop its Industrial Park, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. have been limited in these attempts by a lack of funds to pay for qualified Economic Developers, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. recently purchase a 75-acre farm and approved a HOG Project to be implemented on the farm, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. lacks the expertise needed to ensure the success of the HOG Project,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe would like to take advantage of the Intergovernmental Personnel Act by requesting an Economic Developer for the purpose of developing our Industrial Park and an Agriculture Specialist to assist in the implementation of the HOG Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe is requesting the services of an Economic Developer and an Agriculture Specialist for a period of two years.
