WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribal Council has delegated to the Oneida Business Committee authority to exercise the enumerated powers of the Oneida Constitution, Article IV as amended, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: CDB Property

Lot 2, Volume 6 Certified Survey Maps, page 513, said Map being part of Lots 42 and 43, First Addition to Packerland Subdivision, in the City of Green Bay, West side of Fox River, Brown County, Wisconsin.


WHEREAS, The above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide office space, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
