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RESOLUTION NO. 08-30-06-G

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:
Former Roy K. and Lida H. Metoxen Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Legal Description: See attached.
Tax Parcel Numbers: HB-43
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential housing land use and will not be used for gaming purposes, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

Part of Lots Three (3) and Two (2), Section One (1), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Nineteen (19) East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the North $\frac{1}{4}$ corner, Section 1, T23N-R19E; thence $N89^{\circ}17'34''E$, 290.27 feet along the North line of the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$, said Section 1, to the point of beginning; thence continuing $N89^{\circ}17'34''E$, 208.03 feet along said North line, to the West line of Lot 2, said Section 1; thence $S00^{\circ}12'36''W$, 1127.78 feet along said West line; thence $S86^{\circ}00'19''W$, 208.56 feet along the South line of Lot 2 and 3, said Section 1; thence $N00^{\circ}12'36''E$, 1139.74 feet to the North line of the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 1, T23N-R19E; and the point of beginning.

Parcel contains 235,823 square feet/ 5.41 acres, to the centerline of Edgar Drive.

Parcel contains 230,674 square feet/ 5.30 acres, more or less to existing 24.75 foot right-of-way.
